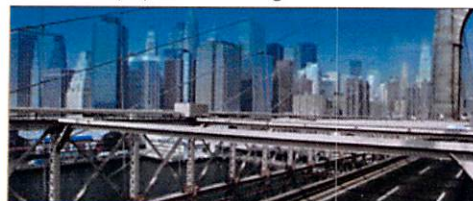

WIFI CONNECTION

Wireless internet is available throughout QUEEN MARY 2 including staterooms. On your device using the WiFi settings select "qm2_guest_internet", then wait for the signal to connect. Start using your web browser and you will be redirected to a login page. On the first visit select 'New User'. Complete the details, then choose the relevant price package. Each time you log out, type 'logout.com'. Should the signal appear inadequate please relocate near the corridor or leave the door ajar. Connection speeds vary depending on satellite positioning and the volume of guests using the internet. For those guests that do not have their own device, computers are available 24 hours a day in the Internet Centre, in ConneXions room 1, Deck 2, between A & B Stairways. For those who require assistance, our Internet Manager is located there; please check the Daily Programme for his desk hours. Please note: Cunard World Club guests with Internet benefits will be credited for the relevant tier amount once purchased. Parents - please contact the Pursers Office or Internet Café Manager for information on limiting your child's Internet account and for additional information.

Any guests wishing to dress more casually are welcome to dine in the Kings Court buffet on Deck 7 and relax in the Winter Garden, but should not use other areas within the ship, including our Alternative Dining Restaurants, out of respect for their fellow guests.

GENERAL EMERGENCY STATIONS DRILL

This afternoon an emergency drill will be held prior to our departure. It is a requirement of law that after boarding the ship, all newly embarking guests must attend and be instructed in their General Emergency Stations. On this occasion we strongly encourage all in-transit guests to refresh themselves with the emergency procedures and attend this drill. On commencement of this exercise, broadcasts will be made and alarm bells sounded, calling you to your Assembly Stations as indicated on the notice behind your stateroom door. Please carry your life jacket with you, do not wear it and for safety's sake do not allow the belt to trail on the Deck. The correct method of wearing a life jacket will be demonstrated to you at the end of this muster. During this exercise all on board services will cease. We apologise for any resulting delay in resuming the ship's services and thank you for your co-operation in these matters of our mutual safety.

SMOKING POLICY

To respect all guests on board QUEEN MARY 2 all public spaces are designated as non-smoking within the ship, with the exception of G32 from 6.00pm (starboard side upper level only) and Churchill's Cigar Lounge. Outside, on the open decks, the starboard side of the aft end of the ship on Deck 8, under the canopy and on Deck 7 aft under the clock are designated as smoking areas. All restaurants are non-smoking, this includes outdoor dining alternatives. Smoking is not permitted in staterooms or on stateroom balconies. Churchill's is a lounge dedicated to cigar and pipe smokers all day. The extensive cigar selection is stored in the built-in humidor area. Electronic cigarettes which do not emit smoke are not permitted in public areas, but can be used in designated smoking areas and on stateroom balconies. We kindly ask you to respect this policy for the safety and comfort of our guests.

GUESTS UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE

All guests under the age of 18 years of age will not be served nor are they to consume alcoholic beverages. Guests may be required to verify their age with an official government issued I.D. such as your Passport or Driving License.
